As in previous years, SLE 2022 was successful in bringing scholars from Europe and elsewhere together to discuss their linguistic research.


According to the feedback we received, the majority of participants (82.9%) evaluated their experience positively, between 8 and 10 on a scale ranging from 1 (min.) to 10 (max.). 



Next Application deadline: 15 December 2022 Notification of the selection: 15 January 2023

Application:

- → a document proving the status of the applicant
- → a short CV (max. 1 page, Calibri 11)
- → a research project proposal including the aims, scope and relevance of the project (max. 2 pages)
- → motivation letter that describes how the funding will be used and how it will help advance the project a budget proposal (max. 1 page, Calibri 11)

The application will be peer reviewed for scientific merit by the Award Committee members.

A written financial report will need to be submitted upon the completion of the grant by the end of the year.

If you are interested to start one of these positions from 1 September 2023, please send your short CV (1 page) and motivation letter, specifying the function you want to apply for to sle@kuleuven.be by 15 January 2023, 12pm. Put the CV and the letter together in one document that bears your name.

Any member in good standing is eligible for these positions.

The Nominating Committee will make a decision before 1 March 2023.

Job description for SLE Treasurer:

- Responsibilities of the SLE Treasurer include:
 - Membership administration, including the 'master list' of members, and fee collection;
 - The SLE bank accounts (now with ING Bank);
 - All financial aspects of the annual conference (including the budget in coordination with the Local Organizers, refunds for plenarists, etc.);
 - o Business relations with third parties (invoices, receipts, etc.);
 - o Annual financial report and annual budget.
- Potential applicants should bear in mind that the SLE is officially registered as a non-profit organization with the Dutch Chamber of Commerce. Therefore, it may be convenient to have the Netherlands as the country of residence. However, candidates with other countries of residence are also strongly encouraged to apply.

Job description for Editor-in-Chief of Folia Linguistica:

- The journal welcomes work from various theoretical perspectives, but contributions should be directed towards a general linguistic audience.
- Folia Linguistica publishes 2 issues per year, each about 300 pages long.
- The Editor-in-Chief is supported by two Associate Editors, as well as an Editorial Board, which is actively involved in the first selection of submissions.
- Responsibilities of the editor include:
 - Appointing an Editorial Board;
 - Creating and maintaining the journal's guidelines;
 - Organization of the review of manuscripts;
 - Coordination with De Gruyter;
 - Taking care of special issues, in collaboration with the *Folia Linguistica Historica* editor;
 - Ensuring that manuscripts are submitted to peer review and language polishing;
 - Ensuring timely and orderly publication.
- The editor serves for a period of three years, and may be re-elected for one term.

Call for committee members

The Societas's new Articles of Association were adopted at the 2022 Annual Members' Meeting.

This means that from now on an annual financial report, stating the Societas's income and expenditure, must be presented to the Annual Member's Meeting for approval.

The decision on approval has to be prepared by an ad hoc financial committee of (at least) two SLE members who are not in the Executive Committee.

Tasks to be carried out by the committee members:

- Checking the accuracy and completeness of SLE's financial administration (accounting of income and expenditure);
- Reporting the audit's findings to the Annual Members' Meeting.

The Societas is looking for candidates to audit the financial administration of the year 2022. The task is to be carried out in spring 2023.
